- A1** State the three things a formulated linear program must contain, and one thing candidates most often leave out. [2]

- A2** Write $3x + 2y \leq 20$ and $5x + 2y \geq 30$ as equations, introducing the appropriate extra variables. [3]

- B1** Maximise $P = 4x + 5y$ subject to $x + y \leq 10$, $2x + 3y \leq 24$ and $x, y \geq 0$, using the vertex method. [4]

- B2** Describe the objective line method for the same problem, and say what it shows that the vertex method does not. [4]

- B3** Find the value of each slack variable at the optimum and say what it means. [3]

- C1** Explain how the answer would change if x and y had to be whole numbers, and why rounding a corner is not a safe method. [4]
