SECTION A · Warm-up

- A1** The binomial expansion of $(1 + x)^n$ stops after $n + 1$ terms when n is a positive whole number, but never stops when $n = -1$. Explain the difference, and state the validity condition for the never-ending case. [2]

- A2** Expand $(1 + x)^{-1}$ in ascending powers of x up to the x^3 term, and state the validity. [3]

SECTION B · Standard

- B1** Expand $(1 + 4x)^{1/2}$ in ascending powers of x up to the x^2 term, and state the range of x for which the expansion is valid. [4]

- B2** Expand $(1 + 2x)^{-2}$ up to the x^2 term, state the validity, and use the expansion to estimate 1.02^{-2} . [4]

- B3** Expand $(4 + x)^{1/2}$ up to the x^2 term, and state the validity. [4]

SECTION C · Stretch

- C1** Use the previous expansion to estimate $\sqrt{4.2}$, and explain briefly why the estimate is so accurate. [3]
